Getting to KnowPhyllis Conrad

This time, in this special case, I would like to begin with Phyllis' reply to my request for advice for those entering or already in the field of church music. In her letter she writes:

"If nothing else comes of this article, I would hope that all the organists out there are encouraged to involve and encourage youth in all types of musical endeavors. One of my real fears as a special areas teacher is that the "arts" programs in the public schools are going to slowly be eroded away by the emphasis on testing. I am already hearing threats of music and special areas programs being eliminated because of changes in school funding. It is a scary time for people who teach in related arts areas and should be a scary time for musicians in general. I shudder to think of what type of individuals we will produce in the future if their educational experiences do not include anything beyond learning to successfully take a test in reading and math. Maybe I could start a crusade for the AGO to support the arts in public school programs."

I start with this because Phyllis, herself, as a high school student, became fascinated with the organ through a public school program in organ study. During her high school years, Cedar Crest High School instituted an organ study program as part of the high school curriculum, and participating students were given organ lessons during the school day. When the high school building was constructed, an organ was installed in the auditorium, and that instrument was used for organ instruction. The program was taught by Ruth Killian, who was on the teaching staff at the high school and also served as organist at Salem Lutheran Church in Lebanon. Unfortunately, after a number of successful years, budget cuts in the music department resulted in the end of the program. After becoming fascinated with the organ, Phyllis also studied privately with Ruth during her high school career and intermittently after that time during her college years,

She is a graduate of Cedar Crest High School in Lebanon and Mansfield University, where she earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Home Economics Education. While a student at Mansfield, she studied piano for three semesters with Dr. John Little, who was a member of the MU music faculty. She was

later awarded a Master's Equivalency from the PA Department of Education for graduate studies completed at Marywood College, Penn State University and Millersville University.

After college graduation, she married, changed churches and lost access to a good practice instrument. At the same time, she invested most of her energy into the demands of a new teaching career. After a span of about twenty years, the old Hammond organ in her church fortunately needed to be replaced, and the decision was made to purchase a new Rodgers 2-manual organ. While it was not a pipe organ, it was a delight after many years of listening to the old Hammond! It was at that time that her interest in playing the organ was rekindled and she once again began organ lessons. This eventually led her to begin private study with Shelly Moorman-Stahlman.

Phyllis believes that at some level, she has always had a desire to be a church organist. As a teen, she was confirmed into the Lutheran Church and was always intrigued by the integral part music played in the worship experience. The encouragement and opportunities she received from her first teacher fueled her fascination with church music. Because she had limited opportunity as a youth to gain experience in her own church, one of her focuses has been to give young people in churches as many opportunities as possible to share their talent during the worship experience.

Even during the years that she was inactive musically, Phyllis had always experienced the desire at some level to be involved in church music. When the opportunity to return to private study presented itself, her initial desire was just to learn to play better, since she knew that the years of dormancy had taken a toll on her skills. As time progressed and she became more confident, she began to realize that maybe the dream of being a church musician at some level was not out of her reach. It was a dream that evolved slowly and has continued to unfold as opportunities have presented themselves. Phyllis cites several people as having been instrumental in this process: Shelly Moorman-Stahlman, whose excellent instruction, encouragement, patience and understanding have fueled Phyllis' motivation to pursue this endeavor, and her husband, whose support and encouragement has been ongoing despite periodic obstacles. Not to be forgotten is the group of congregations who were willing to give a novice an opportunity to gain experience and overlook the blunders of inexperience.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved on a motion by Arnold Sten and a second by Fran Treisbach. Brian Rice, Treasurer, distributed financial reports for the period May 1, 2007, through August 7, 2007. The CDs for the Shenk and Yocum Scholarships will be up for renewal next month. A motion was made by Karen Appel and a second by Shawn Gingrich to transfer monies from the General Checking Account to meet the \$1,000 required balances for the renewals. In January money will be taken from the General CD and put back into the General Checking Account. The Treasurer's report was approved on a motion by Josephine Freund and a second by Mary Jane Nelson.
