Meet Harry Strack

As a six-year-old, growing up on his parents' Christmas tree farm in Central Pennsylvania, Harry already knew he wanted to be a musician. He had no particular link to a musical relative, teacher or performer, but he knew. As we know him now, he has been musically involved in Grace United Methodist Church in Lemoyne since 1997, working first as a substitute organist, then as a part-time organist on a rotation schedule, and at present, as the full-time organist in that parish.

Harry is an experienced choral director, pianist and harpsichordist, in addition to his organ playing. Additionally, he teaches in the areas of piano, organ and voice, as well as trumpet performance, theory and composition. He has arranged and composed for the keyboard for some 30 years.

With Mansfield University as his alma mater, he earned a B.M. degree in piano performance and educational certification, and took graduate courses towards his M.M. degree. His performance recitals and accompanying others took him through New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania, and even a dedication recital for a new Rodgers Touring Organ in Tucson, Arizona. Harry accompanied NYS Regional and State choral festivals from 1980 to 1982, and using piano, harpsichord and organ, was accompanist for vocal, cello, violin, trumpet, clarinet, flute soloists and small ensembles.

As a Junior High School choir director at Owego Apalachin Central School District between 1976 and 1982, he directed six choirs, including an all-male chorus and a select girls ensemble of 12 eighth and ninth grade singers who were given an A+ on a test by the NYS Music Association, performing a piece of the highest difficulty, usually performed by seniors. While there, he began a "Solo Festival" concert, in addition to the standard Christmas and spring concerts, and encouraged approximately 50 students per year to perform solos, duets or small ensembles for an audience of 500+.

Prior to his service at Grace U.M., Lemoyne, he was employed from 1980 to 1990 at Central United Methodist Church in Endicott, New York, first as a substitute for the full-time organist for six years, then as Chancel Choir Director from 1986 to 1990. His choir performed three anthems each week for worship services and one special performance each year with full orchestra, that included Handel's "Messiah" and Faure's "Requiem."

Harry enjoys traveling in his spare time, and hopes in the future to plan some duo recitals with other keyboard performers, as well as further extend his career as a teacher of all keyboards and voice.

He has already joined the "Lunch Bunch" group of AGO members who meet monthly to chat and chew, and we will enjoy his company at many of the other events in the future!

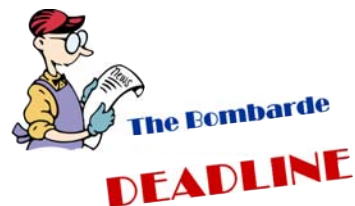
